Introduction

The Revenue Administration Division of the Comptroller of Maryland is responsible for collecting the alcoholic beverages and tobacco tax, and The Alcohol and Tobacco Commission is responsible for regulation and enforcement of the State's alcoholic beverages and tobacco tax laws.

This annual report provides data and statistics related to both the tax collection function of the Revenue Administration Division and the regulatory function of the Alcohol and Tobacco Commission. All information in this report, including but not limited to revenue, licensure, and other regulatory activities are for fiscal year 2021: July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

Taxes

The Maryland Alcoholic Beverages Tax is imposed at the following rates:

Distilled Spirits * \$ 1.50/gallon or 39.63 cents/liter

Wine \$ 0.40/gallon or 10.57 cents/liter

Beer, ** Hard Cider & Mead \$ 0.09/gallon or 2.3778 cents/liter

(* If distilled spirits contain a percentage of alcohol greater than 100 proof, or 50% alcohol, an additional tax for each 1 proof over 100 proof is 1.5 cents for each gallon or 0.3963 cents for each liter

** Flavored Malt Beverages (FMBs) are taxed at the same rate as beer.)

Local jurisdictions are prohibited from imposing an alcohol tax. After paying refunds and the administrative costs of the Comptroller, alcohol beverage taxes are distributed to the General Fund of the State.

The Maryland Tobacco Tax is imposed on cigarettes and other tobacco products. Local

jurisdictions are prohibited from imposing a tobacco tax on cigarettes. From July 1, 2020 through March 13, 2021 the tobacco tax rate for cigarettes was \$2.00 on a 20-cigarette pack, an additional \$.10 cent tax for each cigarette in a package of more than 20 cigarettes, and a \$ 0.10 cent tax for each cigarette in a package of free sample cigarettes. If the cigarette pack has 10 or fewer cigarettes, the tax was \$ 1.00 for each pack. Effective March 14, 2021, the tobacco tax rate for cigarettes is \$3.75 for each package of 20 cigarettes and 17.5 cents for each cigarette in a package of more than 20 cigarettes.

The tax rate for OTP is a percentage of the wholesale price, which means the price for which a wholesaler buys other tobacco products, exclusive of any discount, trade allowance, rebate, or other reduction.

From July 1, 2020 through March 13, 2021 the tax rate for OTP was 30% of the wholesale price, which means the price for which a wholesaler buys other tobacco products, exclusive of any discount, trade allowance, rebate, or other reduction. The tobacco tax rate for cigars was 70% of the wholesale price of the cigars. The tobacco tax rate for premium cigars was 15% of the wholesale price of the premium cigars. Effective March 14, 2021, the tax rate for OTP is 53% of the wholesale price of the tobacco products. The tobacco tax rate for cigars is 70% of the wholesale price of the cigars. The tobacco tax rate for premium cigars is 15% of the wholesale price of the premium cigars. The tobacco rate for pipe tobacco is 30% of the wholesale price of the pipe tobacco.

Tobacco tax revenues are used to pay for refunds, and the Comptroller's administration costs with the balance distributed to the General Fund of the State.

Revenue

Total net receipts from alcoholic beverages and tobacco license and permit fees, and miscellaneous income for fiscal year 2021 was \$427,982,429

Compared to fiscal year 2020, fiscal year 2021 tax revenues indicate the following changes: 36.5% increase in distilled spirits; a 22.8% increase in wine; and a 4.8% increase in beer with an overall increase of 24.8 % in alcoholic beverages tax collections.

The net receipt from the sales of cigarette tax stamps in the amount of \$ 322,191,409 reflects a 0.9% increase from fiscal year 2020. The net receipt from Other Tobacco Products tobacco tax is \$ 47,347,617 an increase of 9.2% compared to fiscal year 2020. Other Tobacco Products include chewing tobacco, moist snuff, pipe tobacco, cigars, and roll-your-own tobacco.

Tobacco taxes provided the largest percentage of net receipts at 75.3, compared to alcoholic beverages tax revenues. As a percentage of net tax revenue, distilled spirits accounted for 5.5%; wine: 1.7%; and beer: 1.9%. Other tobacco products tax accounted for 11.1% of the total tax revenues and Tobacco Floor Tax accounted for 4.4.

The Alcohol and Tobacco Commission (ATC) issues alcoholic beverages manufacturer and wholesaler licenses, and various permits. Local liquor boards issue alcoholic beverages retail licenses. Cigarette manufacturer and wholesaler licenses are issued by the Alcohol and Tobacco Commission (ATC). The Clerks of the Court issue cigarette retail licenses and as of May 1, 2011, OTP retailer licenses and tobacconist licenses.

The tobacco license fees collected consist of cigarette manufacturer, cigarette wholesaler, other tobacco products manufacturer, and other tobacco products wholesaler licenses issued by the ATC.

Alcohol and tobacco license fees are paid to the General Fund. Cigarette license fees are to be used to enforce the Maryland Cigarette Sales Below Cost Act.

LOCAL BILLS:

1. House Bill 256 Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages Licenses - Hours of Sale (Senate Bill 396)

(1) Establishing hours of sale for a holder of a Class B-D-7 beer, wine, and liquor license from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. along the south side of Frederick Avenue between South Augusta Avenue and South Loudon Avenue in Baltimore City.

2. House Bill 312 Harford County - Alcoholic Beverages - Assisted Living Program License (Senate Bill 386)

(1) Establishing a Class ALP (assisted living program) beer, wine, and liquor license in Harford County; authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Harford County to issue the license to a manager of an assisted living program, but not more than five ALP licenses to a person; authorizing the license holder to provide beer and wine for on-premises consumption by a resident or guest; authorizing the license holder to store liquor, prepare mixed drinks, and serve liquor or mixed drinks; specifying a license fee of \$3,500; etc.

3. House Bill 323 Queen Anne's County - Alcoholic Beverages -

Repeal of Place of Worship Prohibition (Senate Bill 855)

(1) Repealing a prohibition on the Board of License Commissioners for Queen Anne's County from issuing a license to an establishment located within 500 feet of a place of worship.

(1) Authorizing the holder of a Class 9 limited distillery license and a 6-day Class D beer, wine, and liquor license to apply to the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore City to convert the existing Class D license to a 7-day Class D beer, wine, and liquor license in the 46th alcoholic beverages district; authorizing the Board to issue a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license and a Class D beer and light wine license in a certain area if a memorandum of understanding has been executed with Brewer's Hill Neighbors, Inc.; etc.

- 10. House Bill 632 Garrett County - Alcoholic Beverages Act of 2021 (Senate Bill 451)**
(1) Repealing certain requirements that the Board of License Commissioners for Garrett County charge a one-time issuing fee for certain licenses; and altering the types of alcoholic beverages that a license

holder may purchase from a wholesaler or a retailer in Garrett County.

11. House Bill 677 Baltimore County - Alcoholic Beverages - Board of License Commissioners - Qualifications (Senate Bill 38)

- (1) Requiring that each member of the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore County be a resident and voter of Baltimore County.

12. House Bill 679 Anne Arundel County - Alcoholic Beverages - Class MT License (Senate Bill 489)

- (1) Establishing a Class MT (movie theater) beer and wine license in Anne Arundel County; authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Anne Arundel County to issue the license to the owner of a movie theater who holds a crowd control training certification; authorizing a license holder to sell beer and wine to certain patrons at retail for on-premises consumption; specifying that a license holder may serve a patron only a single serving of beer or wine at a time, with a maximum of two servings of beer or wine per patron per day; etc.

13. House Bill 680 Anne Arundel County - Board of License Commissioners - Chief Inspector (Senate Bill 490)

- (1) Requiring the Board of License Commissioners for Anne Arundel County to employ a chief inspector; and providing an annual salary for the chief inspector of \$30,000.

14. House Bill 814 St. Mary's County - Alcoholic Beverages Licenses - Annual Fees

- (1) Requiring the Board of License Commissioners for St. Mary's County, for the 2021-2022 licensing period, to waive the entire amount of the annual fee for certain alcoholic beverages licenses under certain circumstances; and terminating the Act on June 30, 2023.

**16. House Bill 880 Allegany County -
Alcoholic Beverages Licenses -

- (1) Authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Allegany County, for the 2020-2021 licensing period, to reimburse holders of certain alcoholic beverages licenses the entire amount of the annual license fee and to reimburse holders of certain other alcoholic beverages licenses a certain amount of the annual license fee for the 2021-2022 licensing period; etc.

**17. House Bill 883 Allegany County -
Alcoholic Beverages - Class B-D
Beer, Wine, and Liquor License
(Senate Bill 677)**

- (1) Establishing a Class B-D beer, wine, and liquor license in Allegany County; authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Allegany County to issue a Class B-D license for use by a certain restaurant; authorizing a license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor for on-premises consumption; requiring the license holder to submit a certain Food Alcohol Ratio Report to the Board once every licensing cycle; providing an annual licensing fee of \$700; prohibiting the issuance of more than two Class B-D licenses in a single year; etc.

**18. House Bill 974 Prince George's
County - Alcoholic Beverages -
License Sanctions and Sunday Off-

- (1) Altering the alcoholic beverages licenses for which the Board of License Commissioners for Prince George's County may issue a Sunday off-sale permit; authorizing the Board to issue a Sunday off-sale permit to the holder of any Class A alcoholic beverages license, or to the holder of any Class B alcoholic beverages license with an off-sale privilege; altering a certain reinvestment requirement for an applicant for a Sunday off-sale permit; requiring the Board, by January 1, 2023, to conduct a study of Sunday off-sale permits; etc.

**19. House Bill 1018 Charles County -
Alcoholic Beverages - Class 4

21. House Bill 1100 Harford County - Alcoholic Beverages - Gift Basket Permit (Senate Bill 390)

- (1) Establishing, in Harford County, a gift basket permit; authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Harford County to issue the permit to a person whose business includes the sale and delivery of gift baskets; providing that a permit holder is subject to certain alcohol awareness training requirements; limiting the total annual sales from

alcoholic beverages to 10% of the annual gross sales of the permit holder; establishing a permit fee of \$100; etc.

22. House Bill 1108 Washington County - Alcoholic Beverages - Special Event Permits for Wineries

- (1) Increasing from 32 to 60 the number of times per year a holder of a Class 3 winery license or a Class 4 limited winery license may use a certain special event permit in Washington County.

- (1) Authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Howard County to issue up to six Class A licenses in each election district in the county; authorizing the Board to issue more than six Class A licenses in each election district in the county, provided that the total number of Class A licenses in any election district does not exceed one Class A license of any type for every 4,000 residents of the election district as determined by the latest census; and providing for the prospective application of the Act.

**25. House Bill 1155 Howard County -
Alcoholic Beverages - Delivery Ho.

- (1) Authorizing a holder of a Class A alcoholic beverages license in Howard County to deliver alcoholic beverages in the county; requiring that an employee making deliveries be at least 21 years old; requiring an individual receiving an alcoholic beverages delivery to provide certain proof of age; providing for the manner in which an individual receiving

a delivery of alcohol provides proof of age; requiring the Board of License Commissioners for Howard County to approve a certain certification; etc.

- (1) Authorizing an alcoholic beverages inspector to issue acitation in Howard County; requiring an inspector to complete a training program in the use of arrest authority and pertinent police procedures; prohibiting an inspector from carrying a firearm in the performance of the inspector's duties; requiring the Howard County Police Department to employ certain inspectors, rather than requiring the Chief of the County Police Department to provide a sworn member of the County Police Department as an inspector; etc.

**27. House Bill 1240 Frederick County

- (1) Altering the authorization of the holder of a stadium license in Frederick County to sell beer and wine in styrofoam containers on the licensed premises.

28. House Bill 1242 Frederick County - Alcoholic Beverages - Consumption Permits (Senate Bill 793)

- (1) Establishing a beer and wine consumption permit and a beer, wine, and liquor consumption permit in Frederick County; authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Frederick County to issue the permits to holders of Class A alcoholic beverages licenses to allow for on-premises consumption of beer and wine; requiring an applicant for a permit to submit an application to the Board; authorizing the Board to issue a permit under certain circumstances; providing for the renewal of a permit; etc.

29. House Bill 1270 Frederick County - Barbershop and Beauty Salon Beer and Wine Licenses - Alterations (Senate Bill 694)

- (1) Increasing from 5 ounces to 12 ounces the amount of beer that a holder of a barbershop or beauty salon beer and wine license in Frederick County may provide to a barbershop or beauty salon customer for on-premises consumption.

30. House Bill 1272 Frederick County - Alcoholic Beverages - Alcohol by Volume - Wine (Senate Bill 792)

- (1) Altering the percentage of alcohol by volume that establishments holding certain alcoholic beverages licenses may serve in Frederick County to 22%.

31. House Bill 1288 Baltimore City - 40th District Alcoholic Beverages (Senate Bill 755)

- (1) Authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore City to issue a Class C beer, wine, and liquor license in certain areas of the 40th alcoholic beverages district in Baltimore City under certain circumstances; prohibiting certain license holders in certain areas of the 40th alcoholic beverages district in Baltimore City from selling alcoholic beverages before 10 a.m. or after 10 p.m., with certain exceptions; etc.

32. Senate Bill 424 Baltimore County - Alcoholic Beverages - Class D Beer, Wine, and Liquor License

- (1) Repealing a prohibition on the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore County from issuing a Class D beer, wine, and liquor license for use by a drugstore in Baltimore County.

- (a) License fees are collected from manufacturers, wholesalers, railroads, steamboats and airline companies.
- (b) The distilled spirits and sparkling and fortified wine tax was created on December 5, 1933 at \$1.10 per wine gallon not over 100 proof. The tax on distilled spirits increased to \$1.25 per wine gallon on 100 proof or less on October 1, 1939 and increased to \$1.50 per wine gallon on 100 proof or less on July 1, 1955.
- (c) The manufacturer's tax on distilled spirits began on April 1, 1936 at the rate of 5 cents per proof gallon. The rate decreased to 2 ½ cents per proof gallon on June 1, 1937, brandy and neutral spirits were exempt. This tax was repealed on September 30, 1939.

- (f) Certain permit fees were established June 1, 1943 at an annual fee of \$5.00 for each permit. Non-Resident Storage Permits created on July 1987 (\$500.00 fee). Alcohol Awareness Program Permit created on July 1, 1989 (\$15.00 fee). Numerous license and permit fees increased effective May 1, 1992. Alcohol Awareness Instructor's Permit created on October 1, 1994 (\$5.00 fee); Family Beer and Wine Facility Permit on June 1, 1996 (\$400.00 fee); Private Bulk Sales Permit on October 1, 1997 (\$25.00 fee); Winery Special Event Permit on October 1, 2000 (\$25.00 fee). Direct Wine Seller's Permit has been repealed and replaced on July 1, 2011 by Direct Wine Shipper Permit (\$200 fee) and Common Carrier Permit (\$100 fee). Fee per vehicle for Vehicle Identification card increased from \$2.00 to \$10.00 on June 1, 2003. Fee for a Charity Wine Auction permit reduced \$500.00 to \$10.00 on June 1, 2004. Non-resident winery permit created on April 25, 2006 (\$50.00 fee). Brewery Special Event Permit created on June 1, 2008 (\$25.00 fee). Resident Dealer Permit created on July 1, 2009 (\$200 fee), and the fees for a Public Storage and Transportation Permit, Nonresident Dealer's Permit, and a Bulk Transfer Permit increased to \$200.
- (g) Tobacco tax on cigarettes effective July 1, 1958, at rate of 3 cents per pack. BULK TRANSFER PERMITS

Under Alcoholic Beverages Article §2-111(b), a person whose license has expired or otherwise has been discontinued may, within 60 days, obtain a bulk transfer permit in order to transfer with or without consideration whether by sale, gift, inheritance, assignment or otherwise, the

stock of alcoholic beverages on hand as of the last day the license was effective. The fee for a bulk transfer permit is \$200. The table below indicates the number of bulk transfer permits issued in the respective jurisdictions, an approximate 33.3% increase from the prior year.


